





Keynote Speaker Peter Bardaglio on "Connect and Collaborate: Climate Action and the Energy Transition in Ithaca, NY"



<u>Peter Bardaglio</u> is the Executive Director of <u>Ithaca 2030 District</u> and Coordinator of <u>Tompkins County</u>. <u>Climate Protection Initiative</u>. The 2030 District is a new model for urban sustainability with a focus on cutting energy use, water use, and transportation emissions by 50 percent by 2030. The year 2030 is considered a deadline for achieving a carbon-free society in order to mitigate climate change. <u>Ithaca</u> became the first city in New York to join the 2030 District Network.

Join Peter to explore how cross-sector collaboration in Ithaca, NY has provided the foundation for effective climate action, accelerated the transition to a new energy economy, and led to a more resilient community - with a focus on how the Tompkins County Climate Protection Initiative, the Ithaca 2030 District, and the Ithaca Green New Deal have contributed to reducing greenhouse gas emissions, establishing mutually beneficial private-public partnerships, and promoting equity in the community.
